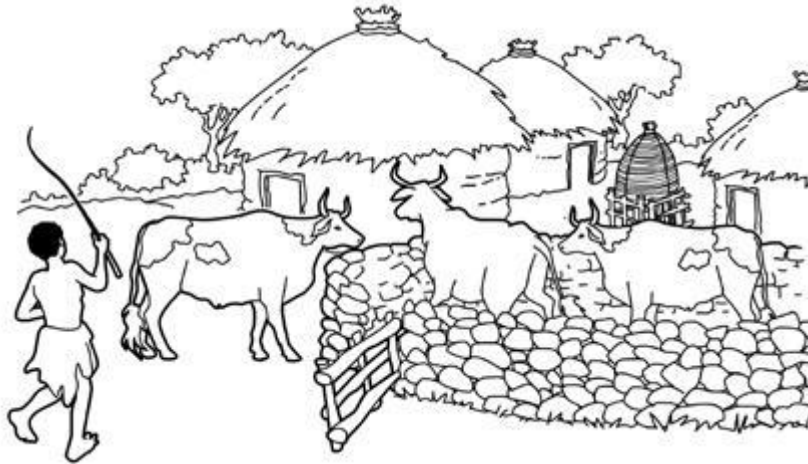

The picture refers to **early African farmers**.

Reasons for this:

- The homes are more permanent and are made from mud with thatch roofs.
- They kept cattle.
- There is a cattle kraal made from large stones.
- The cattle are being driven into the kraal which is circular and in the middle of the homestead.
- There is a small building on stilts in which the grain, seeds and food would have been stored.
- The person who is chasing the cattle is a young man/boy. This was one of the jobs of the young men.

The picture refers to the **Khoikhoi**.

Reasons for this:

- The homes are placed in a circular shape.
- The homes are made from branches/pole frames placed in a dome shape with grass mats covering the frames.
- The cattle were kept in the middle of the circle of huts. There is an ox being led into the circle of homes.
- They kept cattle.
- The animal (ox) is being used as a pack animal and is carrying something on its back.
- The people are wearing clothes and blankets made of leather or skins.
