Ancient	Very old
Flood	A large flow of water that rises and spreads over the land.
Harvesting	Collecting ripe food from the fields.
Sowing	Planting seeds in the field.
Astronomy	The study of the sun, stars and planets.
Society	A group of people living together with shared laws and traditions.
Pharaoh	An Egyptian king.
Vizier	The highest official in Ancient Egypt who served the pharaoh.
Scribe	A person whose job it is to write down important things.
Mummies	Dead bodies preserved with oils and wrapped in strips of cloth for burial.
Afterlife	Life after death.
Tomb	A building in which a dead person is buried.
Pyramid	A large stone tomb for an Egyptian king or queen, with sides like triangles.
Sphinx	A stone carving with the head of a human and the body of a lion.
Hieroglyphics	A form of writing that uses pictures instead of letters.
Papyrus	Paper made from a special grass-like plant that grows in wet areas.
Physicians	Doctors.
Artificial	Created by humans, not naturally made.
Anatomy	The study of how bones and muscles in the human body fit together.
Physiology	The study of how living bodies work.
Preserved	Kept in very good condition.
Chariot	A cart with two wheels that was pulled by horses and was used for battles and races.
Intact	Whole, not broken or damaged.
