

ENGLISH LOCKDOWN LESSONS: Week 12

FOLKTALES CONTINUED

Lesson 1:

You finished week 11 off with creating a circle map of your folktale ideas.

Now, using those ideas, you are going to complete a flow map where you can put your information from your circle map into the correct paragraph, as well as add more information to each paragraph.

Your folktale will be made up of 4 paragraphs:

1. Introduction:
Here you will set the scene for where the folktale takes place and introduce the character(s).
2. Make reader aware of the possible drama that could take place.
3. Drama takes place.
4. Ending:
Here the story is completed, and the reader is satisfied with how the story ended.

Using the flow map, brainstorm ideas for each paragraph. Template in folder.

Lesson 2 and 3:

After all that planning, I am sure that you are ready to write your own folktale.

Your folktale must include the following:

- A title
- Use 4 paragraphs – paragraph 1 is your introduction paragraph where you set the scene. Paragraph 4 is your conclusion paragraph, where you end your story and includes the moral.
- A moral
- A conflict / situation / drama
- Direct speech
- 120 – 160 words
- A picture
